The Commission shall quarterly hold at its principle principal place of business regular monthly public meetings on the second Thursday of-each month and other meetings January, April, July, and October at 9:00 a.m. and at such times and places as its members may elect. Any two (2) members of the Commission shall constitute a quorum for the purposes of transacting the business of the Commission and two (2) votes in favor shall be necessary for a decision by the Commission at any meeting of the Commission. The Commission shall meet on the second Thursday of each month at 10:00 a.m. at the Commission office. Meetings shall be conducted using Roberts Rules of Order. All meetings of the Commission shall be publicized in accordance with the Alabama Open Meetings Act. Any change to the regular Commission meeting shall be publicized in accordance with the Alabama Open Meetings Act.
